Smartphone Inspection Camera

IF YOU ARE IN NEED of a visible inspection, during maintenance or a condition inspection, this camera attachment for your smartphone is a great way to check out those hard-to-reach areas. With an internet search for an endoscope, I came across a wide variety of choices through the many usual online supply sites.

I bought a CrazyFire endoscope inspection camera for \$17.99 from Amazon that plugs directly into my Android phone

or a laptop via a convertible USB port.

For you iPhone users, I did find a few compatible versions

for a little more money.

The camera came with an adjustable LED light along with a hook, magnet, and a 90-degree mirror attachment. Using the company's camera app for my phone I am able to take still pictures and movies. The quality of the picture is great, allowing me to view the inspected area with great clarity. Most manufacturers offer cameras with different lengths up to 25 feet and flexible or semi-solid cables that hold their shape and are waterproof. For a less than \$20 investment, I am able to inspect areas that were out of reach before.
